### BUILDING YOUR EMERGENCY SAVINGS

- Start small → \$500-\$1,000 starter goal
- Grow steadily → Build 3–6 months of essentials
- Keep it accessible → Use a savings or money market account
- Automate savings → Set up recurring transfers for consistency

### WHERE TO KEEP YOUR SAVINGS

- Keep savings safe and separate
- Use high-yield or money market accounts
- Avoid long-term CDs or investments
- Choose NCUA-insured accounts





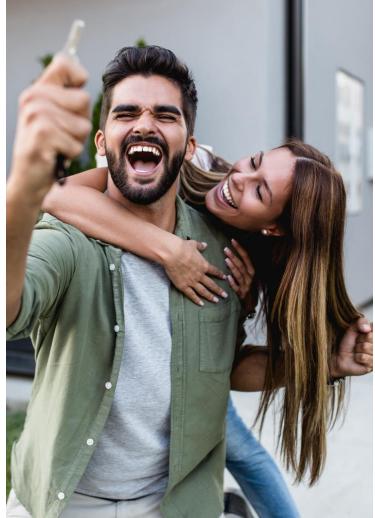

- Reduced income or job loss







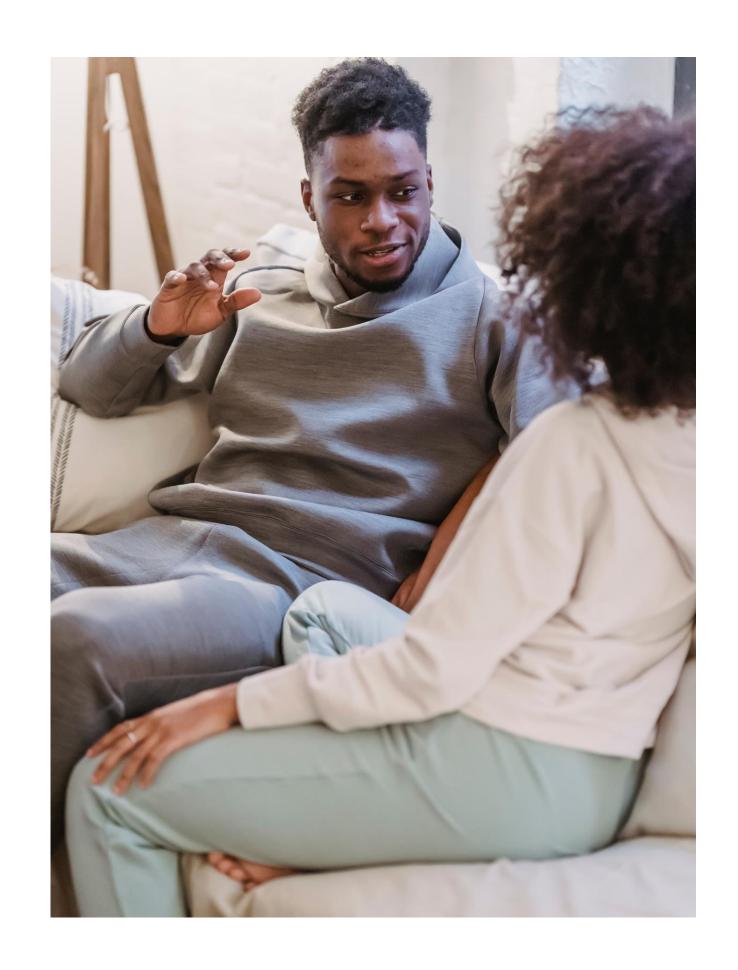
### MANAGING THE TRANSITION
